The Season of Lent

Lent lasts for 40 days and we use this time to prepare for the tragic, then glorious events of Easter. During Lent, tradition in the Church encourages us to pray, give up something or do something extra and give alms to the poor. In this way we are making the best possible preparation for the most important season of the Church.

During Lent different classes will be joining the Parish for Mass each week. The children in Y4, Y5 and Y6 will also have the opportunity to go to confession. Our Mini-Vinnies will be leading additional prayer opportunities. Throughout Lent, the children will be praying the Stations of the Cross and in the final week of term – Holy week, we are planning reconciliation services in church and a KS2 liturgy based on the events of Holy Week.

We are planning a number of fundraising events over the next few weeks across the classes this includes our annual easter egg raffle and tickets will go on sale shortly - 20p each. We know that times are tough for families, so please give what you can. I would like to thank the staff in advance because they are the ones who very kindly donate all of the easter eggs.
