As we return to school the Church is celebrating the great feast of Easter – Jesus risen from the dead. This celebration goes on until the solemnity of Pentecost (Sunday 20th May), the birthday of the Church. At Pentecost we celebrate the outpouring of the Holy Spirit who empowers and enables us to follow in the footsteps of Jesus.

During this half-term the Church dedicates the month of May to Mary, Jesus' mother. We will celebrate together the gift of Mary as our mother in the May Procession on Friday 4th May.

Reminder about absence procedures

Our School and Local Authority responses to pupil's low attendance.

Illness and First Day Call

If your child is unable to attend school through illness you should inform us by telephone on the first day of absence **before 8.30am**. Alternatively you can call in person at the Office. It is useful to know the expected day of return. If you do not supply us with this information we have a duty to contact you so that we may be sure of the child's whereabouts as this is a safeguarding measure.

What we are aiming for

The National Average attendance is approximately 96.5% for the year, with outstanding attendance 100%. As a school we have set a target of 97.5% as the level we expect our children to achieve

What is considered as poor attendance.

Anything below 95% is lower than expected, if attendance dips below 90% we will have serious concerns.


Below 90% is regarded as persistent absence by the DFE. Here at St. Patrick's school we are aiming for every pupil to achieve attendance levels of at least 96.5%. We monitor each pupil's attendance weekly.

At the end of each half term we will identify all those pupils whose attendance has fallen below 92% and will issue a courtesy letter or make a telephone call informing parents. We will then continue to monitor the pupils' attendance on a weekly basis and hope to see a pattern of unbroken weeks developing.

Children's attendance at school is monitored on a daily basis and notable absences or patterns of absences are followed up by the Parental Support Advisor, Mrs Hudson, and in more serious cases the Attendance Officer. The school prides itself on its very good attendance figures. Many thanks for your support.

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Safeguarding our children

Child Protection – this is sensitive area in which all staff receive regular training. Here, school and other services for children and families all work together to support the needs of children. There are 3 designated Child Protection Staff, Mrs Kneeshaw, Mrs Newton and Mrs Longbottom. If you have any concerns please contact them through the school office. There is also a named governor for child protection, Mrs Margaret Morrison. The safeguarding and child protection policy can be viewed by parents on request or on the school website.

Please do not drive up the school driveway. If you are late, park your car outside and walk your child up the driveway. We have had several parents who have driven too fast up the drive and we will be asking all parents to follow the same rules.

Class assemblies

When it is your child's class assembly, please WALK up the driveway and come through the main Reception Office area. You will then be taken to the school hall. Many thanks.

ONLINE SAFETY – Keeping your children safe at home

In school we teach the children about how to keep themselves safe when they are online and what to do if they are concerned. We have filtering and monitoring systems to ensure children are kept as safe as possible.

We recently had a case reported to school where pupils were accessing unsuitable sites etc at home. We would like to remind parents of some useful ways you can keep your child safe whether they are 5 or 15!

Please don't think it wouldn't happen to my child!

We are asking EVERY parent whose child has access to a phone/ ipad / computer /xbox / playstation to regularly check any conversations they are having with others.

We always tell the children to tell an adult **if they see or hear something inappropriate** but we also need all parents to be vigilant too please.

Children who are able to access **Youtube** can be very vulnerable to seeing and hearing things you would not want. Please always oversee them using these sites.

Some ways to keep your child safe:

- Regularly check devices
- Limit times when your child can use the device
- Ensure they use the devices within your vision and hearing (perhaps not in bedrooms)
- Only allow age appropriate games / apps
- Let school know if you are notice anything that is not appropriate for children

Talking points

- Which sites and apps can be used and by who?
- When is it/isn't it OK to use the internet?
- Do your children have to ask for permission to download games, apps, or spend money online?
- What parental controls will you use, and when and how will you use them?
- Be positive about the benefits of the internet and take a balanced view.
