Ofsted Inspection

Just before we broke for Easter we were inspected by Ofsted. The school was last inspected in November 2018.

Why does Ofsted inspect schools?

They inspect schools to provide information to parents, to promote improvement and to hold schools to account for the public money they receive. School inspections are required by law. We provide an independent assessment of the quality and standards of education in schools, and check whether pupils are achieving as much as they can.

We had an ungraded inspection therefore, the inspector visited with the question... Does St.Patrick's Catholic Primary School continue to be a good school? It was a very thorough process and the short report will be sent home, with every child when it is published. A huge thank you for your overwhelmingly positive comments on the parent portal. The staff and children did a super job showcasing our wonderful school.

After-school clubs

These are now up and running for the summer term. The last week of clubs will be week beginning **Monday 1st July**. We have a few spaces available in the KS2 multi-skills club on Friday. We are now opening this up to our Y5 children. If your child is in Y5 and would like to attend this club please let the office know; there is a charge of £1 weekly. Reminder all clubs finish at 4pm. It is important that your child is picked up on time. We will now operate a rule of 3 late pickups in a term and your child will lose their place in all after-school clubs that term. Thank you for your co-operation in this matter.


Y4 and Y1 also have to complete statutory assessments in June. Please encourage to child to practice at home in preparation for this.
